

Poll: Cabinet Members' Seats on Coal

The Australia Institute commissioned polling by ReachTEL in the federal electorates of Wentworth, Cook, Curtin, Dickson, Kooyong, Sturt and Flinders on the evening of 8th June 2017.

- 675 residents in Cook.
- 691 residents in Curtin
- 627 residents in Dickson
- 662 residents in Flinders
- 692 residents in Kooyong
- 681 residents Sturt
- 684 residents in Wentworth

Respondents were asked about voting intention in a Federal Election and then on issues to do with coal mining in Australia and the Adani coal mine proposal.
