uComms conducted a survey of 1,136 residents across Tasmania during the night of 22nd October 2019.

Question 1:If a State Election were to be held today, which of the following will receive your first preference vote?

Now turning to a national issue in the federal parliament.

The Medivac law deals with refugees or people seeking asylum being held offshore who require urgent medical assistance. Under the law, two independent Australian doctors can recommend a temporary transfer to Australia for medical treatment, if the Minister is satisfied there are no security issues.

The Medivac law came into force in the last Parliament and the current Parliament is considering whether to keep or abolish that law.
